

Course Aim:

To increase the capacity of disability service providers to effectively support people with intellectual disability in the area of sexuality and relationships.

Content:

- Discuss definitions and models of sexuality
- Explore the impact of myths, barriers and personal values on the sexual rights of people with disability
- Identify the roles and responsibilities of support staff including relevant legal and policy contexts
- Demonstrate strategies for building the capacity of people with disability including educational resources
- Discuss strategies for working in partnership with parents
- Explore a range of reproductive and sexual health issues including sexual assault, safe sex and contraception
- Develop a sexuality information session plan

Structure:

This two-day course is designed for workers in the disability service sector including managers, support workers, case managers and allied health professionals.

Completion of this course will enable participants to go on to complete the 'Sexuality Program Planning' course.



Participants successfully completing the training and optional follow-up workplace based assessment tasks will be awarded a nationally recognised Statement of Attainment (CHCCED311A: Provide sexual and reproductive health information to clients) which may be credited towards completion of Community Services Package (CHC08) qualifications (e.g. Certificate III in Disability). Assessment is included in course fee.
